- Mission: "Intended to help students and counselors work together to establish an appropriate path toward transferring from a public California community college to a public California university."
- · Partnership between CCC, CSU, and UC
  - Soon, California private and independent schools







#### **ASSIST.org: Transferable courses**

#### Search transferable courses

- CSU/UC Transferable courses (unit credit)
- CSU GE-Breath Certification Courses
- CSU History, Constitution
- IGETC areas
- UC Admission Eligibility courses










- Click one of the radio buttons to get a list of courses that meet that criteria
- You only need to select the CCC that courses are taken at.
  - Then select by department, prefix or UC Transferability Area
  - Use all departments or all areas to see all courses.
- Switch to demo of UC Transfer Admission Eligibility Courses to show what courses meet UC-E, UC-M and the Four other courses.

#### **ASSIST.org: Articulation**

- Search for articulation agreements by campus –
  - Major
  - Department
  - General Education (GE)
- Not all institutions will publish all types of agreements
- Be cautious of warning messages indicating the selected year may not be available










- For articulation agreements you have to select a source institution and a receiving institution.
- Some campuses may only publish major agreements. Some may not publish General Education. Others may publish all.
  - Items not published will be unselectable and greyed out.

#### **ASSIST.org: Major explorer**

- Hosted by Los Medanos College
- Let applicants search career areas and disciplines to see which CSU or UC offers a compatible major.









Formerly part of ASSIST but now hosted by Los Medanos College, the major explorer is a tool you and your students can use to explore majors by area and discipline, see which CSU and UC campuses offer a major in those areas.

• Although it may not be fully updated at times, this is still a great resource for students exploring to get an idea of what college campuses may offer what they are interest in and what major name it might be under.

#### **ASSIST.org: The Good**

- Partnership is now between California Community Colleges, CSU, UC and California Independent Institutions!
- Major templates display all lower-division courses for a degree in the major.
  - For students interested in going above the minimum. Will be better prepared for 2+2 transfer
  - Templates usually indicate which courses are required for admission
- Know what courses are transferable along with any limitations.







• California private and independent schools will start with 2024-2025 year. Expect their templates and agreements to be published soon.

#### **ASSIST.org: Limitations**

- Agreements are managed by the campus
  - Major template format isn't standard, but designed by the campus to meet their needs
  - Fits the campus needs on what prospective students need to know
  - Publish timelines vary by campus
- No information for students interested in transferring out of state or with outof-state coursework.







• Watch for the warning that the current year isn't available to indicate that a campus hasn't published agreements for the current year.

#### Other limitations not listed

- Might not display what general education courses are needed
  - System minimum requirements (7-course pattern/Golden Four) may be additional courses if not already listed.

#### **ASSIST.org:** When to use

- · Best for when a student has
  - Decided the major they want to study
  - · Identified the campuses they want to prepare for
  - Completed coursework at CCC
- · Great resource for
  - · Admission-specific criteria
  - · Major preparation by campus
- Translate TAG and admission required courses from to UC Courses to your courses







- Not a comprehensive list of when to use ASSIST.org
- Since the campus publishes templates, you know you are receiving the most up-to-date admission information for the major.
- Often, a campus will publish (online and printed materials) the required courses for TAG
  or admission using their course numbers. Assist is helpful to determine which courses
  are at your school by using the major template or department list.

# **UC Transfer Admission Planner**

(UC TAP\*)

\*Not to be confused with UCLA's Transfer Alliance Program (TAP) or UC Berkeley's Transfer Alliance Project (TAP)

UCLA's Transfer Alliance Program (TAP, https://admission.ucla.edu/apply/transfer/ucla-transfer-alliance-program) and UC Berkeley's Transfer Alliance Project (TAP, https://cep.berkeley.edu/tap) are both great support programs to assist students. We won't be

discussing those programs. We will be focused on the UC Transfer Admissions Planner tool.

#### **About UC TAP**


- Mission: UC TAP is a free online tool to help prospective UC transfer students track and plan their coursework.
- UC product
- Helps students track their progress toward meeting UC's admission requirements
- Allows UC and CCC staff to communicate important information to prospective transfer students







• UC TAP was created by the UC Davis IT team (Thanks, Davis. Go Ags!)



- List of information available to students who create a UC TAP account.
- A quick view of student facing side of UC TAP and options available.

#### **UC TAP: CCC counselors**

- Check the status of a student's TAG
- See all coursework that has been entered by the student from every institution attended
- View preliminary unit and GPA calculations, as well as completion of the 7-course pattern
- Communicate with individual students, and send notifications and reminders to specific subgroups of students

- The UC TAP administrator at each CCC may have more abilities, especially with mass messaging students at their college.
- Note that UC Staff are also in UC TAP to work with students. If a campus reviews TAG submissions that review is completed and the decisions can be viewed as well.

#### **UC TAP: The Good**

- Allows students to indicate campuses interested in.
  - Those campuses are likely to reach out and invite to transfer programs
- Campuses might review the student's submitted coursework and offer advising
- Same account/site to submit a UC TAG application
- Depending on your campus practices, you may be able to review coursework students have submitted
- Entered coursework may be imported into the UC Application







- UC TAP is not required to apply to the University of California. Having an account does not affect a student's admission. However, the advising students might receive by having an account may help them prepare for a stronger application.
- Not Listed:
  - Allows CCC and UC to message students that have expressed an interest in UC.

#### **UC TAP: Limitations**

- UC only
- Account required Username and password
- Not the same account to submit a UC Application
- No official evaluation of non-CCC coursework









- UC Only Unlike assist CSU and independent colleges are not part of UC TAP.
- Although you can import the courses entered in the UC TAP into the UC Application, they
  do not share the same account. Students will need to create an ApplyUC account or reuse the one they might have when they applied as a first year
- UC TAP is a great resource when interested in UC but, it's not a place to provide an evaluation of non-CCC coursework.

#### **UC TAP: When to use**

- When a student has decided they want to prepare for a UC campus.
- Before a student meets with a UC representative.
- When a student wants to submit a TAG application.
- Every Semester
  - Get ahead of submitting the UC application by having coursework ready to import.







- Not a comprehensive list of when to use UC TAP. If the student is interested in UC, encourage them to start a UC TAP.
- Some campus advisors may look at a student's UC TAP to review completed coursework and their interest before meeting with them, allows us to be more prepared to help the student.
- Every Semester Keep UC TAP up to date.

## Program Pathways Mapper

(PPM)

Views of a few different Program Pathways Mapper (PPM) sites show that each participating campus will have its own maps. It is not really a centralized site like UC TAP and ASSIST.org; instead, it will be managed by each campus. Although the main site has a list of participating campuses and links to those sites.

Participation in PPM is not required and is not fully adopted. As of August 2024 the PPM main site reports 55 CCC, 6 CSU, 2 UC and five out of state schools (Washington and Oregon).


#### **About PPM**

- Mission: Connects the CCC, UC, and CSU systems so that students can view a map of intersegmental curricular pathways, easily transfer between segments, and reduce excess units taken on the path to degree or program completion
- Managed by the Foundation for California Community Colleges










- An example plan showing the CCC only plan.

# PPM: Sample 2 Maps are designed by each host campus, so maps are for that campus's program. • Unlike ASSIST, you see the CCC's courses. No need to convert.

- Not all campus programs may be mapped, UC Merced has more than one engineering program. An example of looking at Merced College's maps for Engineering, only one 2+2 map to UC Merced is listed.
- Click on the boxes that show "Choose a course" to see a list of available courses that meet the requirement.
- Although the host campus designs he maps, any partnering school will review and approve the map for accuracy.



- An example of what a partner 2+2 plan looks like between the fourth term and fifth term when the student would transfer.
- Host campuses may be CCC, CSU or UC.
- CCCs can partner with CSU or UC campuses to produce these 2+2 plans, showing first two years at the CCC and the last two years at the partner four year university.
  - Course numbers for the first two years will show as the CCC courses. The last two years will show as the partner school's courses.

#### **PPM: The Good**

- Gives students a good idea of what their two years at the CCC look like and what the additional two years at the four-year school look like.
- Lots of information about careers in the program area
  - Salary
  - Growth
  - Career options

- Each campus determines its own maps, so it is tailored for its population
- Link to make a counseling appointment (if available)







• Salary, Growth and Career Options are displayed on the map for the program selected.

#### **PPM: Limitations**

- Map doesn't indicate which courses meet major preparation or minimum admission requirements
  - These courses should be included in the plan.
- Extra advising may be needed if student "falls off" the designed path.
- Each campus determines its own maps and may not show all current offerings.
- May or may not show UC/CSU maps and may or may not show specific campus maps.







- Although maps created between the CCC and partner school should include all required courses, the map doesn't indicated which are required for admission versus which are required for the degree.
  - The map does indicate which courses are General Education, major courses, or elective courses
- If the student can't get into the courses mapped to the first term (pre-requisite issues) or has to retake courses due to a low grade the map may no longer be valid to follow. Extra advising may be required to create an Indvidual map offline.
- The maps released by the host campus, may not reflect all viable transfer options.

#### PPM: When to use

- Great for students still exploring majors and campuses.
- Can see what the program's first two years look like at their CCC for several major options.
- May be able to see what all four years look like
- Provides statistics on salary, growth, and careers for the degree area.







- With the maps categorized by degree areas and including certificates, it's a great start for students to start exploring programs.
- The map provides a nice visual of what courses should be taken first and gives a nice start of their two or four year plan.

- Map is likely to include

  GF
- Information about:
  - Paths to 2-year degrees
  - Paths to 2+2 degrees
  - Salary, growth and careers
