



This chart reflects all California Community College transfer applicants, admits, and enrollees from 2020 to 2024, however with a cutoff of enrolled student counts at 2023, as 2024 enrolled

As you can see, the transfer pipeline was interrupted during the pandemic, but we are starting to see a rebound. The University admitted 26,430 students from CCCs, an increase of about 1,900 from fall 2023 when UC made 24,514 admission offers.

Even though we admitted more students this year, the admission rate for CCC students did decline a bit this year. (This year it was 76.1% and last year it was 76.9%.) This is because the growth in applications outpaced the growth in admitted students.

Systemwide, the proportion of domestic CCC admits from underrepresented groups rebounded quite a bit this year, having increased by 1.3 percentage points, from 36.6% of admitted students to 37.9%.

Of note: this year, Latino/Latina students make up the largest proportion of domestic California Community College admits at 31.2%, up from 29.9% last year. [Last year, Asians were the largest group.]

UC is anticipating growth in our enrollments, and that includes transfer students.

Our work together can help strengthen the transfer pipeline to UC for all CCC students.

Fall 2025 application deadline

EXTENDED DEADLINE

- Monday, December 2, 2024
- Application is open!
- Filing period: October 1 until December 2
- *The extended filing deadline is for fall 2025 applicants only









For the fall 2025 cycle **only**, the application submission deadline is Monday, December 2 since the Thanksgiving holiday falls on November 28 this year. The application is open now so please encourage your students to start working on their apps now. They can file the application anytime between October 1 and December 2, 2024.

TAG streamlining

UC Transfer Pathways can help students who want to make themselves competitive across the UC system. Created in 2015 and available for 20 majors, Transfer Pathways are a common set of major prerequisites across the campuses that offer the major.

UC faculty recently approved 10 additional Pathways for some of UC's more highly sought-after majors. These additions bring UC's total count of Transfer Pathways to 30. We expect these new Transfer Pathways to be available for students transferring to UC in fall 2026 and later, which means California community college students may begin to use these pathways to support their academic planning as early as this fall.

More information regarding the new Transfer Pathway expectations and participating majors is forthcoming.

We continue the campaign for transfer excellence and have expanded outreach and advising to high school juniors and seniors, and first year CCC students; and provided resources including professional development to CCC counselors and advisors.

Recognizing the need to have transfer information more streamlined, later this month, we are launching a UC Transfer Hub site that will enable a one-stop-shop for transfer information, and we are enhancing the current admissions site for more seamless navigation for high school and community college students and returners.

Beginning spring semester 2025, UC Merced is piloting online STEM major prep courses to be offered (initially) to CCC students at select colleges.

Cal-GETC implementation & timeline

- Cal-GETC approved courses will display in ASSIST June 2025, effective for students to enroll in at their CCC Fall 2025
- UC campuses who accept IGETC and plan to accept Cal-GETC will accept both IGETC and Cal-GETC certifications for at least the next 3-4 years
- Cal-GETC certification guidelines and expectations are in the most recent Cal-GETC Standards document (per ICAS)

Cal-GETC aligns with IGETC – except:

- Plus Area 1C Cal-GETC for UC
- Minus LOTE and Lifelong learning
- No provisions for partial Cal-GETC certification







As you all know, Cal-GETC courses will be available to CCC students beginning in Fall 2025. In most ways Cal-GETC aligns with IGETC – this was intentional. There are a few changes to note between the patterns:

- Area 1C Cal-GETC applies to both UC and CSU, and has been redeveloped as a new area to reflect that
- LOTE will not be included in the Cal-GETC pattern (but the designating footnotes in ASSIST will continue for qualifying courses)
- Lifelong learning will not be included in the Cal-GETC pattern (this may impact CSUbound students but not UC-bound)

UC campuses which accept IGETC certifications will also accept Cal-GETC certifications. The Cal-GETC Standards are governed by the Intersegmental Committee of Academic Senates (ICAS) and include guidelines for certification. No provision for partial certification exists yet.

Qualifying LOTE courses offered at a CCC campus may still be completed by students but will not be considered part of the Cal-GETC pattern.

UC Dual Admission—Program expansion

INCREASED ACCESS AND OPPORTUNITIES

- Who: Dual Admission invitees who did not respond to our initial offer and all eligible first-year students who were not admitted to a UC of choice
- What: Opportunity to join the Dual Admission program if they are enrolled at a CCC
- When: Early October with a three-week opt-in window









As we continue to evaluate the UC Dual Admission program, we look for improvements and ways to serve more students. As such, we are expanding our program this year. While from inception and per the Assembly Bill 132 text, UC invited only those first year applicants who were ineligible or missing one or more A-G courses, under the program expansion, UC is extending the invitation to include all A-G eligible first-year applicants that were not admitted to UC, aimed specifically at students currently enrolled at a California community college post high school graduation. UC's Dual Admission program has comprehensive supports to help transfer students attain a world-class education and degree from the University of California.

The supports include:

The UC Transfer Admission Planner (UCTAP) which allows students to enter coursework and track progress towards meeting the requirements of their Dual Admission contract. The tool also allows UC staff and CCC staff with UC TAP accounts, to view Dual Admission details on their end and communicate important information to program participants.

Each newsletter contains invitations to webinars, virtual appointments, a video series, and other relevant topics.

Campuses offer a wide variety of services, ranging from 1:1 appointments to transfer events hosted throughout the year.

UCDAVIS

Sometimes we don't have much to say about new majors, but this year I've got big news to share. Next fall, UC Davis launches a new Business major!

If your students have already started a UC application, they'll see that this fall we'll be accepting applications for first-year students for the new UC Davis Bachelor of Science in Business—giving students multiple pathways into the business and finance world. The new degree offers a core foundation anchored in math, statistics and economics, leveraging the strengths of our already existing programs in Economics and Managerial Economics. Business majors, however, will have the option to choose to specialize in accounting, finance, marketing and business analytics, or management and strategy.

Some additional information you will likely want to know:

- 1. The major will be selective at the time of launch, which means that major preparation will be required.
- 2. Major preparation will align with the UC Transfer Pathway for Business Administration—with the exception of the intro to business course, which will not be required. Students who follow the pathway will be well prepared for the program at UC Davis.
- 3. GPA requirements for transfer admission are working their way through various committees for approval, but you can expect the minimum to be above a 3.0 and below a 3.5, though it's important to note that whatever minimum is set, it will be a minimum and selection will likely be higher. We also expect that the program will be quite strict in terms of waiving any major preparation requirements.
- 4. We expect to enroll 75 students the first year, and because of expected demand, the major will not be available for TAG.
- 5. It's also important to note that a student who is prepared for Business is also prepared for Managerial Economics and Economics by default. Our advice in the past has been to select a non-selective alternate major, but in this case, we'll likely advise students preparing to apply to Business to select Econ or Managerial Economics as an alternate if either of those majors interest them. We'll share more as those plans solidify.

It is open to the incoming first-year for fall 2025. Transfer enrollment will be available for fall 2027.

UCDAVIS

As noted previously, major preparation is the key to admission to selective majors, and we've listed them on the screen for you here. This includes all of the majors in the College of Biological Sciences and the College of Engineering. The reason we are sticklers for major preparation is really related to student success after transfer, not because we want to put artificial barriers in place for students. For example, transfer students in the College of Biological Sciences have the highest graduation rates, and we have evidence that it's directly tied to the major preparation requirements. We strive to put requirements in place that put students on a path to success—no more, no less—so that once students transfer, they're on the path to finishing that degree in a timely manner.



- UC Davis Coffee Center opened May 2024
 - A part of the College of Engineering, is the first academic research and teaching facility in the U.S. entirely dedicated to the study of coffee.
 - 7,000-square-foot facility includes brewing laboratories, a chemical and analytical laboratory, and a pilot roastery
- Writing Center launches
 - The new UC Davis Writing Center offers university-wide writing services for undergraduate students, graduate students, faculty and staff. One-on-one consultations, workshops, application guidance, writing groups and more are available at this writing hub. The center is located in one of our newest learning spaces on our campus, the Teaching and Learning Complex.
- New student housing under construction
 - We plan to break ground on a new on-campus residence hall next spring. Last fall, we opened a new apartment complex for students with families.
 - UC Davis is committed to a goal of housing 48% of Davis-based students on campus. By doing so, we help accommodate demand in the City of Davis overall. Currently, we house on campus about 38%, or 15,000 students.
 - We have a one-year housing guarantee for new first-year and transfer students. We also offer second-year housing programs. Student Housing and Dining strives to provide housing or connect students to housing resources year-round.

- UC Irvine received the most TAG applications of all UCs for fall 2024. As a reminder, students
 must report all coursework regardless of domestic or international as part of their TAG
 application, and UCI does not pre-evaluate TAG applications or any coursework taken outside
 of the CCC.
- UC Irvine is a minority-serving institution, with federal designation as a Hispanic-Serving Institution (2017) and an Asian American Native American Pacific Islander-Serving Institution (2016)
- In 2021, UC Irvine become a First-gen Forward Institution as part of the Center for First-generation Student Success, the nation's first recognition program acknowledging higher education institutions for their commitment to first-generation student success. This year, 47% of admitted transfer students from California Community Colleges self-identified as first-generation college students.

TAG UPDATES

- TAG pre-review is no longer offered to minimize delays in application review.
- Applicants are encouraged to use UC Irvine resources such as website and advising appointments to ensure that they are on track to meet requirements.
- By end of fall 2024, applicants for 2025 must:
 - · Meet 3.4 UC cumulative GPA,
 - Meet their chosen major's minimum GPA in any completed required major prep courses,
 - · Meet specific course grades if applicable for their major, and
 - · Complete their first UC-E and UC-M courses



- Applicants are admitted to UCI by major, and nearly 60% of transfer applicants applied to only 10 of our more than 85 majors.
- Students are encouraged to create and complete the Transfer Academic Planner so that our admissions counselors can better advise them and they can receive our admissions communications.



- LIFTED invests in educational attainment that has been empirically demonstrated to reduce
 recidivism and enhance workforce development. Incarcerated individuals who earn an A.A. in
 sociology from Southwestern College with a GPA of at least 3.5 are eligible for admission to
 UCI. They will be able to obtain a B.A. while serving their sentence or matriculate on campus if
 they're released before finishing their course of study.
- UCI's Program in Public Health is currently ranked #19 among public health programs at public universities in the U.S. In 2024, the program is expected to expand to an official School of Population & Public Health, expanding the education, research, and professional opportunities available to UCI students.
- Underground Scholars Program creates a pathway for incarcerated, formerly incarcerated
 and system-impacted individuals to higher education through outreach, retention programs
 and advocacy. Students can find a physical space on campus to meet and study, receive
 academic tutoring and advising, peer coaching, leadership development and more resources
 to help them navigate their time at UCI.










A new, two-story, state-of-the-art Health and Counseling Center opened in 2024 and offers integrated and holistic care in a welcoming and student-centered environment.

The new 63,400 square foot School of Business building provides increased space and modern facilities to meet UCR's growing enrollment demands.





We have had edits to a few key majors. Starting with Molecular & Cellular Biology, B.S. now absorbing the pharmacology major. The coursework has not changed but now what is on a student's degree will note optional emphases. Here are what students can see when they apply to UCSB for fall 2025: optional emphases in Biochemistry-Molecular Biology, Cell and Developmental Biology, Microbiology, or Pharmacology

We have also had changes to the Music, B.M. As a reminder, we have Music Studies that has not changed at all. For the BM in Music an audition is required. Now, our list of majors will include an emphases in Cello, Composition, Piano, Viola, Violin, or Voice.

We have made this announcement before but want to remind everyone that Chemistry is now a selective major for admission. We'll have major preparation that is required for admission. We also want to note changes coming for fall 2026: NOTE: For fall 2026 admission, calculus-based physics for science majors with labs (PHYS 7A-B-C-L) will be required.

This summer we welcomed our first HSI Director at UCSB, Dr. Fematt will be on campus to support collaboration for HSI initiatives. This comes just in time to celebrate our ten-year anniversary of achieving HSI status.



DELAWARE AVENUE PROJECT

- Opening fall 2026
- Housing 400 upper-division undergrads & 60+ employees
- Student housing will be ~20% < market rate



Family Student Housing

The new family student housing community is being built across the street from existing employee housing, close to a local elementary school, and near the main campus entrance. In addition to the housing buildings, the site will include a community center and garden, an early education center, a maintenance building, and a wastewater treatment facility that are all designed to meet LEED Silver certification.

Delaware Avenue Project

The housing development on Delaware Avenue is just a few miles from the residential campus with excellent access to existing Metro and campus transit routes, as well as the Coastal Rail Trail. It is also near several other UC Santa Cruz facilities, including the Coastal Science Campus, the Westside Research Park, and the Institute of the Arts and Sciences.
