Six University of California (UC) campuses offer guaranteed admission to students from **all** California community colleges (CCC). Interested students must meet both the shared TAG criteria as well as campus-specific requirements to qualify for a TAG. By participating in a TAG program, students can ensure their admission to a specific UC campus. Also, students interested in pursuing the <u>Pathways+</u> transfer option will use a TAG to secure their guarantee.

Shared TAG criteria

To qualify for a fall 2025 TAG at any one of the six participating campuses, students must meet the following criteria:

- Must have completed at least 30 semester/45 quarter UC-transferable units at the time of TAG submission (end of summer 2024);
- Must complete at least 30 semester/45 quarter UC-transferable units at one or more CCC by spring 2025, and a CCC must be the last school of attendance in a regular session;
- Must complete 60 semester/90 quarter UC-transferable units (junior standing) by the end of spring 2025;
- Must complete at least one UC-E (English) and one UC-M (Math) by fall 2024;
- Must complete the remaining 7-course pattern by spring 2025;
- Must require no more than 19 UC-transferable units (semester or quarter) in spring 2025 to reach junior standing;
- Must not exceed 80 semester/120 quarter total UC-transferable units, after applying lower-division limits (students with only CCC coursework and AP/IB/A level credits will not exceed this limit);
- Must earn a 2.0 GPA in all UC-transferable coursework in the current fall/winter/spring terms with no grade lower than C;
- Must submit a TAG application through the <u>UC Transfer Admission Planner (UC TAP)</u> between September 1 and September 30, 2024;
- Must submit the <u>UC application</u> between October 1 and November 30, 2024, and the TAG major and application major for the TAG campus must match;
- Must submit a Transfer Academic Update (TAU) by January 31, 2025; and,
- Must meet all campus-specific TAG criteria outlined in the chart below.

Not eligible for TAG

The following students are not eligible for a TAG at any campus:

- Students who have already earned a bachelor's or higher degree;
- Students previously enrolled at a UC campus who intend to return to the same UC campus;
- Students previously enrolled at a UC campus who were not in good standing when they left that UC; and,
- Students concurrently enrolled in high school at the time of TAG submission.

Please note: transfer students do **not** have to participate in TAG to be considered for admission. In fact, approximately two-thirds of transfer students admitted to UC do not have a TAG. Non-TAG students simply apply for UC admission during the appropriate application filing period.

Merced

- No unrepeated grades of C-, D, F or NP in UC-transferable courses.
- No more than two W grades (including EW grades) in major preparatory courses.
- No more than one deficient grade in major preparatory courses, even if courses have been repeated.

Winter/Spring 2026 TAG applicants

- Merced (Spring 2026):
 - o First UC-E must be completed by end of spring 2025.
 - o Second UC-E must be completed by end of summer 2025.
 - \circ UC-M must be completed by end of fall 2025.
 - o All other TAG qualifications must be met by end of fall 2025.
- Riverside (Winter 2026):
 - First UC-E must be completed by end of spring 2025.
 - o Second UC-E must be completed by end of fall 2025.
 - o UC-M must be completed by end of spring 2025 for non-selecting and selecting majors.
 - All other TAG qualifications must be met by end of fall 2025.



2025-26 TAG Matrix summary of changes

Shared updates:

- All campuses require at least one UC-E and one UC-M by end of fall 2024, with the remaining courses from the 7-course pattern completed no later than spring 2025
- No campus will allow more than 19 UC-transferable units (semester or quarter) in spring 2025 if all 19 units are needed to meet junior standing
- All campuses will use the same high-unit junior/senior definition (80 semester/120 quarter UC-transferable units) for TAG purposes only; students may not exceed that total
 - o NOTE: if all coursework is from one or more CCC, students will not exceed the unit cap
 - o Only students with UC coursework and/or upper-division courses from a 4-year institution may be affected by the cap
- All campuses require a 2.0 GPA in all UC-transferable coursework during the final academic year before transfer (i.e., fall 2024, winter 2025, spring 2025) with no grade lower than C in any of those terms

- Riverside will pre-evaluate TAG applications and notify students before the UC application deadline

 - Merced's Public Health major requires a minimum 3.0 GPA (by end of summer 2024) and completion of IGETC
