
What is Transfer Prep?

The Transfer Prep program builds the **transfer pipeline** across the state by providing students with **admissions advising, along with academic and enrichment resources** and **opportunities needed to successfully transition** from community college to UC and other four-year institutions. Transfer Prep is a critical resource within the **university's outreach efforts** to the 116 California Community Colleges.



Transfer Prep is part of the umbrella of Student Academic Preparation and Educational Partnerships (SAPEP) programing such as: EAOP, MESA, and Puente. Transfer Prep is the community college outreach branch of SAPEP. To learn more please visit the site linked below:

There is a Transfer Prep initiative or program at every UC campus housed under their respective community college outreach or service programs.

Collectively, Transfer Prep programs across the UC system provide services to all 116 California community colleges.

For some UC campuses, Transfer Prep is housed in their Office of Undergraduate Admissions, such as UC Riverside Transfer Recruitment and Evaluation and UC Santa Cruz Transfer Preparation Program. Whereas UC Irvine, UC Berkeley, and UCLA are housed outside of Admissions but work very closely and collaboratively with them.

The goal is to motivate, inform and prepare California community college students to transfer to a baccalaureate degree-granting institution, including selective top-tier research universities such as UCLA.
- 2) CCCP Peer Advising at LA County community colleges: CCCP Peer advisors are current UCLA transfer students who support and mentor community college students aspiring to transfer to four-year, baccalaureate-granting institutions.
- 3) Other services: STEM Webinars, PIQ Assistance Lounges, Transfer Excelencia Scholarship, Transfer Retention Program

Puente's mission is to increase the number of students who enroll in four-year colleges and universities, earn college degrees and return to the community as mentors and leaders to future generations. The program is interdisciplinary in approach, with <u>writing</u>, <u>counseling</u> and <u>mentoring</u> components.

UC Transfer Admission Planner



Across all transfer serving SAPEP programs in 2022-23, 18,159 students were served. 52% of students identified themselves as part of an underrepresented group. Students in SAPEP programs show high admit rates once they apply to UC, noted by the chart on the screen; for fall 2023, Transfer Prep participants had a 90 % admit rate to UC, and Puente participants had an 80% admit rate compared to the general admit rate of CCC transfers of 77%.




