## **Origin story**

#### 2005

Berkeley Hope Scholars founded by one student at UC Berkeley

### **Current state of affairs**

The 2022/2023 budget bill included funding for campus support programs for foster youth across all three public postsecondary systems. Language governing these programs was included in AB 183, the higher education budget trailer bill.









## State funding and expanding programs

An increase of \$6 million ongoing General Fund to increase support for foster youth students across all UC campuses.

### Funding to be used for...

- Outreach
- Collaborations with County Jurisdictions (K-12 Foster youth)
- Targeted marketing of Program Services
- Efforts towards student retention and academic success

#### Retention

- Priority housing and enrollment
- Material and financial assistance
- Free printing & testing materials
- Liaison services w/housing, financial aid, counseling services, etc.
- Community-centered programming

#### Success

- Mentorship
- Career advising & development
- Networking opportunities
- Graduate & professional school preparation
- Tutoring & academic advising







## Tips for counselors

- Be inclusive in your language and programming.
- Be aware of a few resources or organizations for current and/or former foster youth.
- Inform your students of resources and services that will be available to them in the UC system.
- Encourage students who may be current and/or former foster youth that higher education is a path they can take and succeed in.
- Engage in trauma-informed care training, if available or given the opportunity.





## Tips for counselors

- Be informed and raise awareness of the programs and services that your students can access now, while at the community college level, and find out what programs and services you can refer them to once they transition into the UC system
- Use humanizing language when communicating with students involved in the carceral system
- If given the opportunity, engage in trauma-informed care training
- Acknowledge student successes and accomplishments
