

TRANSFER ROADMAP TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

FOR CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENTS

Congratulations! You've already made a good decision to enroll at a community college.

Did you know almost one-third of undergraduates at the University of California (UC) transferred from a California community college? Or that most transfer students graduate within two years and one quarter once enrolling at UC? No matter which UC campus you choose, you'll find a supportive community and hundreds of programs to help you make the most of your college experience. UC is here to help you achieve your transfer goals.

As a transfer student you will:

- Pay less for your bachelor's degree
- Complete coursework towards your UC degree
- Spend less time at UC earning your bachelor's degree
- Have the option to guarantee your admission to one of six campuses offering a Transfer Admission Guarantee

STEP 1

CREATE A UC TRANSFER ADMISSION PLANNER (UC TAP) ACCOUNT AT: UCAL.US/UCTAP

BENEFIT:

- Keep track of your transfer coursework, and calculate your UC transferable units and UC GPA.
- Receive individualized advising from UC represenatives.
- Receive invitations to UC events for transfer students.
- Import your academic history directly from your TAP account into your UC admissions application.

STEP 2

CONNECT EARLY WITH COUNSELORS AT YOUR COMMUNITY COLLEGE

BENEFIT: Participate in programs and learning communities to advise and support you as you prepare to transfer to UC. Some options are:

STEP 3

START TAKING THE REQUIRED UC-TRANSFER ABLE ENGLISH (UC-E) AND MATH (UC-M) COURSES EARLY

BENEFIT: Be more competitive for admission by completing UC-E and UC-M courses as early as possible.

TIP: Complete both UC-E and UC-M courses by the end of the fall term in which you apply.

STEP 4

DECIDE ON A MAJOR AND COMPLETE COURSESREQUIRED FOR THAT MAJOR.

BENEFIT: Improve your chances for admission by completing all required major prerequisite courses.

TIP: Transfer Pathways majors prepare you for all nine undergraduate campuses that offer that major. For more information on UC Transfer Pathways, visit: <u>ucal.us/transferpathways</u>

TIP: If your major is not listed as a UC Transfer Pathway, refer to <u>assist.org</u> to identify the specific list of UC campus requirements offered at your community college.

TIP: If your community college does not offer a required major prerequisite, look for the course at another community college or online.

STEP 5

CONSIDER TRANSFER ADMISSION GUARANTEE (TAG) OPTIONS OFFERED AT SIX UC CAMPUSES

BENEFIT: Guarantee your major and campus by completing a TAG. For more information on the TAG program and requirements, visit: <u>ucal.us/tagchart</u>.

TIP: Pursuing a Pathways major? The Pathways+ option prepares you to be a strong applicant with the security of a guaranteed place at UC via a campus-based TAG. <u>ucal.us/pathwaysplus</u>

STEP 6

COMPLETE THE INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM (IGETC) PATTERN OF COURSES IF APPROPRIATE FOR YOUR MAJOR

BENEFIT: Satisfy lower-division general education requirements for most UC majors by completing the full UC IGETC pattern of courses.

TIP: Prioritize lower-division major preparation at your community college rather than focusing on completing the full IGETC pattern of courses.

TIP: Not every major recommends or accepts IGETC. For more information on IGETC recommendations, see ucal.us/igetc

STEP 7

APPLY FOR UC ADMISSION AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Sept. 1–30: TAG submission period
Oct. 1: FAFSA and CA Dream Act

Oct. 1–Nov. 30: UC application submission

period for fall admission

TIP: Some campuses and majors are open for transfer applicants in the winter quarter/spring semester. Check the website for the most current application dates and open majors. ucal.us/apply
